

As in "The Voice Over", the puppet alternates almost imperceptible movements with disruptive dynamic phases, breaking away from the typical cartoon language and getting as close as possible to a realistic interpretation. The whole set, crafted in several weeks of work, was totally destroyed during the stop-motion shootings to make the final sequences.
